





Questions & Answers



Will it be possible to use USDM data elements to pre-populate data in TMF document templates?



ICH M11 template, specifications, and guidance are planned to be implemented in November 2025. Is TransCelerate planning to have its CPT aligned with ICH M11, including technical specifications that will allow **DDF** and integration with PRISM, by November 2025?

DDF and **USDM** development is aligning directly with M11 techncial specifications as they emerge so there is no dependency on the TransCelerate CPT.





For those currently using the TransCelerate CPT, I am wondering if/when that template will have capabilities that allow DDF and integration with PRISM?



Audience Comment

Question to Dave: In your planned US workshop you just mentioned, will the protocol data be entered via Excel template (like in Berlin) or via OpenStudyBuilder?

DAVE IH: We will use the Excel but also have some new "toys". OSB can only export in USDM, does not use it internally and also does not store the entire protocol document



DAVE IH: Dangerous question:) Depends on how you measure it obviously, but I would say as a rough guide 30% - 40% area.

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


